Vision	Providing Christ's love in a needy world through engaging with people on the streets, who use the night time entertainment sector within the borough, to care, listen and dialogue and offer practical help.
Core Principles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A Christian enterprise. - A non-judgemental approach to addressing the needs of people. - Collaboration through an integrated community approach. - On-going support of our volunteers and training to deliver the service. - Professionalism in the way the service is managed in order to ensure sustainability. - Integrity, honesty, fairness and sincerity are the principles underpinning its activities. - Taking personal responsibility. - Continually adding value.
Volunteers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Have to be over 18 years old and attend a local church. - The selection will be based upon talent, skill, experience and motivation. - Will need to commit to work for 1 night per month and to complete 2 training sessions and 1 induction night before starting (see enclosed training outline for further details).
Training	The training will be held in Uxbridge. Volunteers will attend 2 training and 1 induction sessions covering areas indicated in the enclosed training outline. The Metropolitan Police, London Borough of Hillingdon and representatives of the Hillingdon Street Angels will provide these sessions.
What is provided?	<p>Hillingdon Street Angels will provide:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On-going training. • Criminal Record Bureau check and insurance. • Uniforms. • Communication equipment to enable them to be in touch with the Police and CCTV. • Team base for the team to meet for prayer and briefing. • Appropriate support for Street Angels.



TRAINING OF STREET ANGELS

Each volunteer who is selected to be a Street Angel will be expected to undergo 2 training sessions and 1 induction evenings as follows:

1. Introduction to Hillingdon Street Angels (one week day evening)
 - Vision and ethos of H.S.A
 - Background, expectations, values and approach
 - Effective communication, interpersonal and listening skills
 - Drug and alcohol awareness
 - Safeguarding and protecting vulnerable people
 - Personal safety, including handling conflict
 - Pastoral Communication, to include confidentiality
2. Practical Guide to a Typical Evening and Support for Street Angels (one week day evening)
 - Working with the police, including briefing and de-briefing
 - Introduction of pubs/clubs licensing skipper
 - Process of a typical evening
 - H.S.A policies
 - Support for Street Angels
 - Issue of notebooks, pro-formas, jackets and Ids
3. Working as a Team during the early evening (one Friday evening, 8pm to 12 midnight)
 - Dry run through typical evening starting with briefing from the police and ending with debriefing

There will be a Commissioning Service for each Street Angel.

Role Title:	Street Angel
Reporting To:	Team Leader
Responsible For:	Reaching out with the love of God to those people out late at night.
Main Purpose of the Role:	Working in partnership with the Metropolitan Police and the London Borough of Hillingdon, Street Angels will work in small groups engaging with people on the streets to care, listen, dialogue and offer practical help in a selfless and non-judgemental manner.
Location:	Uxbridge Town Centre

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Prepare for an evening's work with other volunteers through attending a team briefing and prayer.
- Wear official clothing to clearly identify self as a Street Angel and carry the appropriate equipment.
- Engage with people where they are on the streets.
- Provide a non-judgemental approach to addressing people's needs.
- Deliver service to highest ethical and legal standards. Honesty, fairness and sincerity must underpin all activities that are undertaken.
- On the streets, maintain contact with the group at all times.
- Clearly document all conversations, actions and events providing as much detail as is necessary.
- Listen and follow what the Team Leader instructs.
- Attend debriefing and prayers at end of the night.

PRINCIPLE CONTACTS

Management Board, Street Angels' Co-ordinator, other volunteer Street Angels, Metropolitan Police.

CONDITIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- Must be committed to Christian fellowship.
- Must have been a member of a church for at least a year.
- Must agree to and uphold all of Hillingdon Street Angel's values.
- Must be over 18 years old.
- Should be willing to commit to working one weekend night per month.
- Commit to attending all relevant training courses.
- Must agree to Hillingdon Street Angels' working practices and comply with all health and safety procedures.

SKILLS AND VALUES REQUIRED FOR THE ROLE

- Excellent listening skills.
- Caring and helpful nature.
- Good communication ability including good written and oral skills.
- Take personal responsibility.
- Person of integrity and honesty.

KEY METRICS

- Groups of 3 to 5 people will work on the streets one weekend night per week between 10pm and 4am. Each volunteer will be expected to work at least one night per month.
- Two training sessions and 2 induction evenings will be provided to volunteers plus on-going targeted courses to support the role.
